Zagreb, 21st October, 1991

Médecins Sans Frontières deplores the mine attack against its rescue convoy to Vukovar in which two MSF nurses were injured.

The circumstances in which the mine was put on to the route of the convoy, which carried 114 wounded people, are being investigated.

Médecins Sans Frontières does not plan to organize a similar convoy in the near future but will continue its medical mission in the country as usual.

Having succeeded in entering the besieged town and carrying out its evacuation mission, *Médecins Sans Frontières* hopes that a small space for negotiation has been created between warring factions in a conflict where basic humanitarian principles are widely ignored.
